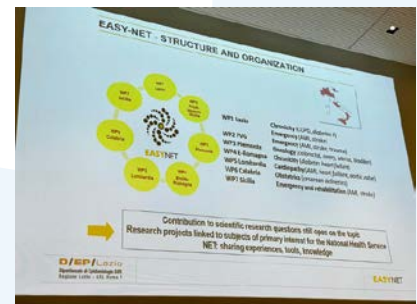

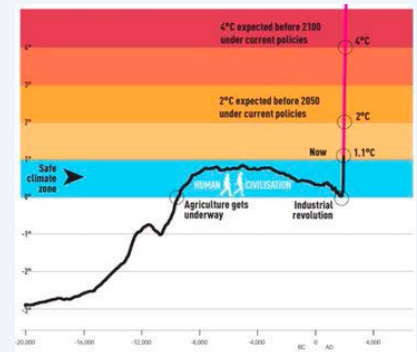

Introduction
Check publication (Pb) bias and related reporting biases threaten the validity of the scientific literature. Theoretical considerations and empirical data have demonstrated that in many fields and settings, there is a preference for publishing studies with statistically significant results and/or larger effect sizes, even among published studies. There is a preference for reporting outcomes and studies with statistically "favorable" results. However, there is a preference for reporting null, non-significant, and/or negative results. 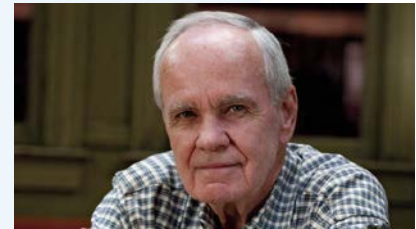
WHAT IS ALREADY KNOWN ON THIS TOPIC
Publication reporting bias is known to be a major threat to evidence-based medicine, but it is less appreciated that an inverse bias may, sometimes, favouring the publication and dissemination of non-significant, null results.

WHAT THIS STUDY ADDS
Inverse publication reporting bias may separate or diverge studies on leading the following studies, where study literature, other manuscript-related attributes, the diversity of researchers and research ability affect.

HOW THIS STUDY MIGHT AFFECT RESEARCH, PRACTICE OR POLICY
More transparency in protocols, statistical analysis plans and registration, reduction of conflicts and heightened awareness may help diminish the impact of inverse publication reporting bias.

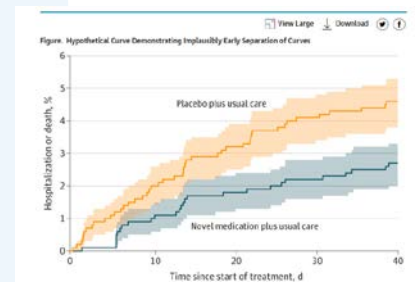
